

"WHAT RUUP 2?" SERIES CONTINUES

By the time you read this, we'll be a couple weeks into Lent, an especially holy time of the year for Christians. Our Lenten worship series, "What R U Up 2?" invites us

to do an unusual practice for Lent. Many Christians give up something for Lent. Rather than giving something up, we'll get up to something. We will consider what Jesus is up to in the scriptures assigned for this season—and, instead of the bemoaning what we can't do, or used to do, in a culture where "measuring up" to external standards seems impossible, we will celebrate the

small things we can do right now to respond to God's call in our place and time.

Come join us each week, online or on site, as we reflect on what we can be up to this Lent for the sake of Jesus.

This series concludes on Easter Sunday. There will be special worship services leading up to Easter, during the time we call Holy Week.



Holy Week Plans

The Palm Sunday (March 24) service will focus on the story of Jesus' entry

into Jerusalem, sitting on a donkey. Sometimes the whole passion story is told and remembered on Palm Sunday. Instead, we're inviting you to participate in two additional special services.

On Maundy Thursday (March 28), we and the members

of United Church of Christ Fremont will gather at 6:30 p.m. in the fellowship hall for a simple soup supper. At 7:10 p.m., we'll move into the sanctuary for a special,

dramatic worship service which will start at 7:15 p.m. If you can't be on site for this service, you can attend on Zoom; register at bit.ly/MaundyThursday2024.

Our Good Friday (March 29) service will be hosted by United Church of Christ Fremont, 38255

Blacow Rd. This service will also begin at 7:15 p.m. Inspired by a painting by Van Gogh, the theme for the service is "On the Threshold of Eternity" and will encourage us, even in moments of great sorrow, to look deeply to see, even if indirectly, the light that every shadow involves. 
INTERFAITH EVENT EXPLORES "BEING GOOD NEIGHBORS"

TCIC acknowledges that conversations around Antisemitism and Islamophobia are desperately needed as instances of intolerance and violence toward these communities are on the rise. Unfortunately, when these topics come up, there can be roadblocks toward productive conversations and learning. The focus of this event will be local, and participants will be learning and discussing how we can be better neighbors to one another here in the Bay Area, especially in Fremont, Union City and Newark, the communities that make up TCIC. In order to ensure that all conversations will be rooted in respect, learning, and care for our neighbors, all attendees will be required to agree to the following Community Communication Guidelines, which will be enforced throughout this event:

- Questions and comments should be made with good intent and in return, we will assume goodwill in others.
- Resilient listening skills in the face of the speakers addressing difficult topics and experiences within the topics of Antisemitism and Islamophobia must be used.
- Geo-Political debate will not be tolerated at this event.
- Protest signs and chants will not be tolerated in this space.

"Sogorea Te' Land Trust is an Indigenous woman-led

land trust based in the San Francisco Bay area that the facilitates return indigenous land to Indigenous people. Through the practices of cultural rematriation. revitalization land and restoration, Sogorea Te' calls on Native and non-native peoples to heal and transform the legacies of colonization, genocide, and patriarchy and do the work our ancestors and



future generations are calling us to do. *To rematriate is* to restore a people to their rightful place in a sacred relationship with their ancestral land.

"We envision a Bay Area in which Ohlone language and

ceremony are an active, thriving part of the cultural

landscape, where Ohlone place names and history are known and recognized and where intertribal Indigenous communities have affordable housing, social services, cultural centers, and land to live, work and pray on." (Taken from the Sogorea Te' website)


Nature can help us solve our climate problems—if we give her a chance.

Regenerating Life takes an ecological approach to unraveling the climate crisis. It offers a deeper look at the underlying causes of global warming, going beyond carbon emissions from the burning of fossil fuels to humankind's relentless destruction of nature in all corners of the Earth. Because ultimately it is nature—the vast biodiversity that exists on our planet—that regulates and balances Earth's climate.

John Feldman, director of *Regenerating Life*, explores how life regulates the climate through photosynthesis and the carbon cycle; the water cycle; the dung cycle; and a vast interconnected soil network of fungi, microorganisms, and plant roots. He dives into the economic and political systems that have encouraged this destruction of Earth through the relentless quest for wealth and dominion.

We can reverse this destructive process by regenerating life across the planet. Feldman visits people who are working on solutions. By working with nature, they are restoring forests, fields, wetlands, and oceans. They are regenerating soils to grow healthy food and build healthy communities, pointing the way to long term solutions to the climate crisis.
